Dr. Michael Himle received a Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee in 2007 and completed his clinical internship at Brown University Medical School. He is currently an assistant professor of psychology at the University of Utah.

He is an expert in behavioral and cognitive-behavioral approaches for understanding and treating childhood disorders with emphasis on Tourette's disorder, obsessive-compulsive disorder, and related conditions.

He has published over 35 peer-reviewed articles and book chapters on Tourette Syndrome and related conditions and has received research funding from the Tourette Syndrome Association and the Trichotillomania Learning Center.

His current research focuses on understanding mechanisms of tic suppression, behavioral management of the "tic triad" (Tourette Syndrome, ADHD, OCD), and the use of technology to enhance and disseminate empirically supported treatments.
